Idea emerged after youth approached Learning Enrichment Foundation

Weston Wheels is now open for business, and local youth are running the shop.

"The youth approached me to see if I could train them to repair bikes, then the idea of a bike shop emerged," said Darren Duke, program instructor for the Bicycle Assembly and Maintenance program at the Learning Enrichment Foundation (LEF). "I think Weston Wheels will be a huge success."

Supported by the LEF and 12 Division Community Police Liaison Committee (CPLC), the youth-led initiative held its grand opening Saturday at 1267 Weston Rd.

It took "lots and lots of meetings" to get the shop up and running with youth involved in the process from the very beginning.

Weston Wheels Youth Committee co-chairs Monique Thomas, 15, and Justice Otoo, 16, spent a lot of time to come up with a solid business

First, they saw there was a need in the community for a bicycle repair service within Mount Dennis.

"There's no close bike shop in the

neighbourhood," said Monique.

Next, they needed a prime location. LEF's Weston Road office seemed to fit the bill.

There was a boardroom and nobody was using it," said Justice.
"And it's in front of the building and everyone can see it.'

Then they started to price their services, ensuring it was affordable
